Amsterdam City Tour

Explore the city of Amsterdam on a small group tour with Odyssey Traveller.

Amsterdam is the capital of the Netherlands, an exciting city of gabled houses with an elaborate and distinctive canal landscape. The city had its roots in a humble 13th century fishing village that settled on the banks of the River Amstel. The river met the IJ Bay, which tended to overflow and flood settlements, until the fishermen built dikes and later a dam—hence the name “Aemstelredamme” (Amsterdam) or “dam in the river Amstel”—to contain the waters. The first appearance of the name *Aemstelredamme* in a historic record was in Count Floris V’s

1275 document granting bridge toll exemption to “people living near the Amstel dam”. This toll privilege in the County of Holland gave freedom to Amsterdam merchants to go wherever they wished, allowing the city of Amsterdam to flourish as the city’s traders shipped merchandise to and from Scandinavia and sailed to the Baltic and the Mediterranean. Amsterdam experienced unprecedented growth in the 17th century, attracting immigrants who found refuge in the city. The large foreign population contributed to the city’s affluence but also contributed to its congestion. In 1613, Amsterdam began to undertake construction in order to expand its boundaries, adding the now-famous—and UNESCO World Heritage-listed—ring of canals around the historic city centre. Today, Amsterdam retains this multicultural character, with residents from 180 different countries living in an open, tolerant society.

This small group tour is offered to travellers who are seeking a five-day extension in the city as part of an Odyssey Traveller escorted small group tour.

The tour stays in a centrally located accommodation in Amsterdam. Each day we set out to explore various parts of the city, typically using public transport, taxis and the rail network to reach the destinations selected, taking in 2-3 key features or attractions of the city. We will be aided by knowledgeable, local guides who will share the history of the city as we explore.

Amsterdam Tour Highlights:

- Amsterdam’s **Museumplein** (Museum square) is an art lover’s utopia. The largest public square in the city is bordered by world-famous museums: Rijksmuseum, Van Gogh Museum, and Stedelijk Museum (Museum of Modern Art). It also hosts open-air exhibitions and markets.
- The **Rijksmuseum** is arguably Amsterdam’s grandest and most popular museum, housing historic art by Vermeer, Frans Hals, and other Dutch masters of the Golden Age. It also houses Rembrandt’s renowned “The Night Watch”. You can read our article about the masterpiece and its restoration [here](#).



- The **Van Gogh Museum** houses the largest collection of paintings, drawings, and letters by the Dutch post-Impressionist master. In 2015, the museum opened a new entrance directly on Museumplein, making it easy to access from the cultural heart of the city.
- The **Anne Frank House** at Prinsengracht 263 offers a sobering exhibition about the persecution of Jews. This was where Anne Frank and her family lived in hiding from the Nazis during World War II, and a must-visit for those who want to learn more about this dark period in Amsterdam's history.
- The **Royal Palace Amsterdam** was originally built during the Dutch Golden Age in the 17th century as a town hall, before being transformed 150 years later into a royal residence by the French king Louis Bonaparte. The palace today is in active use by the Dutch Royal House but is open to the public on certain days so visitors can explore its interiors and learn more about its rich history.
- A **crui**se down Amsterdam's famed canals is a unique and relaxing way to experience the city and view its architecture.
- The original river settlement was built by fishermen fishing for herring, and all over the city one can still find **haringhandels** (herring carts) selling the delicacy. Try a "**broodje haring**" or herring served in a sandwich with pickles and onions.
- A day trip to The Hague on the train.
- Amsterdam is home to several flea markets and boutique shops, a great way to go shopping and treasure hunting!

Itinerary

Day 1

Locations: Amsterdam

Overview: We make our own way to our Amsterdam apartment, where an Odyssey Program Leader will meet with the group. The group will also be issued their public transport pass. The remainder of the day is free so we can settle in our new accommodation.

Accommodation: Citadines Sloterdijk Station Amsterdam or similar

Day 2

Locations: Amsterdam - The Hague - Amsterdam

Overview: Today we will have a full-day excursion to The Hague, with the use of a private coach and with the help of our local guide. We will view the main sights and visit the **Binnenhof**, a complex of buildings that is home to both houses of the Dutch government. The oldest part of the Binnenhof is the Ridderzaal ("Knights Hall"), a 13th-century hunting lodge and ceremonial hall built by the Counts of Holland. The most important ceremony held here is the Prinsjesdag, held annually on the third Tuesday in September when the reigning monarch addresses members of both Houses of Parliament from the throne. En route back to Amsterdam, we stop to view its historical windmills. (B)

Day 3

Locations: Amsterdam

Overview: This morning we will visit the Anne Frank House. The [Anne Frank House](#) at Prinsengracht 263 offers a sobering exhibition about

the persecution of Jews. This was where Anne Frank and her family lived in hiding from the Nazis during World War II, and a must-visit for those who want to learn more about this dark period in Amsterdam's history. We will then walk to the Royal Palace.
